This data can be found in [the Munitions History Program](#) (MHP). To access this information, in MHP go to the menu bar and select "ASIS". From the drop down list, select "PKG/CATALOG/EXPLOSIVE DATA". On the pop up menu select "CAPULDI". This will bring up a search window that may be used to find your items.

[This guide](#) is provided to aid performing self-assessment of ammunition logistics, ammunition surveillance, and explosives safety functions. This document is not intended to supersede, contravene, replace, or modify the publications referenced herein or any other Department of Defense (DOD), Department of the Army (DA), Army Command (ACOM), Army Service Component Command (ASCC) or Direct Reporting Unit (DRU) criteria. Those publications take precedence in the event of any conflict with this guide. Information contained in this guide was current at the time of publication.

This [MIN](#) rescinds the guidance given on MIN 07-09, and will be utilized to update the next publishing of Patriot Surveillance Procedures (SB 742-1410-92-009).

MIN 16-18

CLARIFICATION OF SECURITY CATEGORY FOR TOW AND HELLFIRE MISSILES IN AR 190-11.

This is the [official notification](#) that both TOW and HELLFIRE Missiles are incorrectly categorized in the AR 190-11 as Category I (CAT-I) Missiles. Our office will be working with the proponent to get this corrected in future revisions.

DA G-3/5/7 Managed DODICs as of 15 April 2016

[This spreadsheet](#) lists the DODICs the DA G-3/5/7 is managing as of the April 2016 TA4C.

The Nomenclature column includes additional info for many items. For example, it may tell you that the item has been (or will be) replaced by another DODIC, which means that the new DODIC is the prime. It might also say that the item is SOF unique, which means it is not authorized for use by the regular Army.
