**QUESTION: If an explosives safety DARAD includes hazards to other service personnel or local nationals, do you need to coordinate with those at risk?**

Yes. In the case of other US services (Navy, Air Force or Marine Corps), inform their command if Army explosives storage or operations puts their personnel or assets at risk. If the other Service's explosives storage puts Army troop assets at risk, they need to coordinate their risk acceptance document with you. ## AESIP

### Army Enterprise Material Master Information Page

The Army continues to modernize its ERP business systems to simplify operations, optimize processes, and provide an accurate, Enterprise view of business information to all users. AESIP is a key component of this initiative. AESIP integrates business processes and systems by serving as the Enterprise hub for the Army's logistics and financial ERP business systems.

In order to maintain the AESIP applications and infrastructure support initiatives, AESIP has normal maintenance windows on Tuesdays 1900-2100 ET and Saturdays 2200-0100 ET. The AESIP portal and system are not available for processing during the outage timeframes.

## *Class V Unescorted Access*

**Question: Can the Ammunition Accountable Officer have un-escorted access to the ASP even though she has full access rights to the stock control system? (The AAO and key control personnel do not have unescorted access to the ASP)**

[AR 190-11](#), Paragraph 5-9 discusses Entry Control to Secured Areas, however; question merits a twofold response since person has access to accountability records.

First: Entry Control:

(4) Persons requiring frequent recurring entrance to the area will either be listed on an entry control roster, prepared by the responsible storage commander, or issued a photographic security badge which clearly establishes the authority to enter. The roster will contain as a minimum, the name, grade, and unit or organization of each authorized person.

b. Personnel, including guards or host country guards, whose duties require unescorted access to storage facilities containing classified missiles, rockets, or other classified items will have a security clearance commensurate with the classification of the items involved.

c. A two-person rule will be established for access to storage facilities containing Category I missiles and rockets. No one individual can have access.

Second:

In this circumstance and based on information provided; Accountable Officer can have un-escorted access to the ASP as long as he has no access to the bunkers or ammunition in outside storage.
