Yellow Book: This publication provides the user in the field with a ready "user friendly" consolidated reference to basic data and regulatory criteria. There are also directions for ordering Yellow Books and a link to the Yellow Book App.

JHCS: The Joint Hazard Classification System (JHCS) is the official DOD database of final hazard classification data for the military services' ammunition and explosives.

CAPULDI: Conventional Ammunition Packaging and Unit Load Data Index

DODIC: All Abrams and Stryker Gun Ammunition

The attachments to this AIN (AIN 061-16A, AIN 061-16B) have been approved for use as a safe, field expedient method of removing cartridges stuck in ammunition containers or packaged without nylon pull straps.
