Tom Carter is the LPP Staff Analyst responsible for procurement interfaces and implementation of best commercial practices, particularly with regard to Performance Based Logistics. He develops legislative proposals and implementing DoD policies relating to adoption of best commercial practices in DoD. He works with other Federal activities, including the Office of Federal Procurement Policy and the General Services Administration, to improve overall Federal acquisition practices by increasing competition and enhancing the ability of Federal agencies to obtain best value in their acquisition of products and services.

He has served as a staff analyst in OSD Logistics since 1989. From 1986 until 1989, he was an analyst for the Defense Spares Initiatives Office. He served as a customer service officer in the General Services Administration's Federal Supply Service central office from 1982 until 1986. From 1974 until 1986 he was a customer service officer in GSA/FSS regional offices, working in Washington, DC, Norfolk, VA, and Dayton, OH.
