Ms. J. Lisa Romney is currently a Procurement Analyst in the Electronic Business Directorate of Defense Procurement and Acquisition Policy in the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics.

Ms. Romney's career with the Department of Defense began in 1990 as a Contract Negotiator for the Air Force in the Aeronautical Systems Command (ASC) at Wright-Patterson AFB where she worked in the Research & Development Directorate and the F-16 System Program Office (SPO). Through her early career, Lisa held various contracting positions at ASC and in the 11th Contracting Squadron at Bolling AFB, where she became a Contracting Officer in 1994. In 1997 Ms. Romney was selected for a career-broadening position in the office of the Deputy Assistant Secretary (DAS) of the Air Force (Contracting), where she worked in the Electronic Systems division. Ms. Romney accepted a position in the Joint Electronic Commerce Program Office (JECPO) in 1998. She worked as the Deputy Program Manager for the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) program from 1998 to 2000, and was Program Manager from 2000 to August 2002. Ms. Romney joined the staff of Defense Procurement and Acquisition Policy in August 2002 where she is the action officer for several eBusiness initiatives including the Standard Procurement System (SPS) and the Federal eGov Integrated Acquisition Environment (IAE) initiative.

Ms. Romney is a Certified Professional Contracts Manager (CPCM) and a member of the Northern Virginia Chapter of the National Contracts Management Association. Lisa holds a Masters degree in Business Administration (1990) and a Bachelor of Science degree in Finance (1989), both earned from the University of Utah.
